#### **Housing Development Act to be Amended to Cover Sick Commercial Projects**

The Government is drafting amendments to the Housing Development (Control and Licensing) Act 1966 to extend its coverage to problematic commercial projects, with Housing and Local Government Minister, Nga Kor Ming stating that enforcement under the proposed changes would include blacklisting not only the developer company but also its board members, parent company, subsidiaries and ultimate beneficial owners connected to abandoned or sick projects.

#### Government Will Not Embark on Mega Projects, To Focus Spending on the People

Finance Minister II, Datuk Seri Amir Hamzah Azizan said the Government will refrain from undertaking mega projects with limited impact on the majority of Malaysians in the near term, given global economic uncertainties and will instead prioritise spending on initiatives that directly improve lives such as repairing schools and rural clinics.

#### **Urban Renewal Bill 2025 Tabled in Parliament for First Reading**

The Urban Renewal Bill 2025, tabled for its first reading in the Dewan Rakyat on August 21, 2025, seeks to reduce the consent threshold for redevelopment projects. Housing and Local Government Minister, Nga Kor Ming presented the bill, which is slated for its second and third readings on August 27, 2025.

#### **Consent Snag for Renewal Act**

#### Fadillah Reaffirms Goal of Net-Zero Carbon Emissions by 2050

Speaking at the IGBC Deputy Prime Minister II and Minister of Energy Transition and Water Transformation, Datuk Seri Fadillah Yusof, reaffirmed Malaysia's commitment to achieving net-zero carbon emissions by 2050, calling for stronger collaboration and innovation to accelerate the transition. He emphasised that central to this effort is the Energy Efficiency and Conservation Act (EECA) 2024, which provides the legal foundation for efficient energy use across the industrial, commercial and residential sectors.

### **Nga Urges Industry Players to Prioritise Sustainable, Climate-Resilient Developments**

Housing and Local Government Minister, Nga Kor Ming, in his morning Ministerial keynote address at IGBC, emphasised the importance of developing future cities and projects that are sustainable and resilient to climate change. Highlighting the escalating impacts of climate change such as rising temperatures, extreme weather events and sea level rise, he stressed that these are no longer distant threats but immediate realities for Malaysia and the ASEAN region.
